Steps towards Market Place Pedestrianisation

There has been much in the local press recently about the pedestrianisation of the west end of the Market Place. Let's clarify the two issues that have not been resolved.

Deliveries: including HGV trucks to businesses around the west end. Existing rules state that HGVs must be able to enter and leave an area in a forward manner. This may be ok for a modern purpose built town or development but not possible for a centuries old medieval town such as Wantage without demolishing

buildings which is obviously not possible. So we are waiting for Oxford County Council to decide if a dispensation can be given.

The taxi rank: taxi licences and parking places are issued by the Vale District Council but the land belongs to the County Council.

Again we are waiting for common sense and realism to prevail and create a workable solution to allow the permanent pedestrianisation, and for both deliveries to businesses and for taxis to operate safely.

WANTAGE COMMUNITY HOSPITAL NEWS

Consultation has now taken place with residents having had an opportunity to give their views on what future services should be available there.

'We need to find a solution that meets the growing needs of the community' says Jenny Hannaby, chair of Wantage Town Council Heath Sub-Committee.

The OX12 postal area population is set to rise by 55% between 2011 and 2031.

Feedback was considered vital before the NHS works up the detail of what improvements can be made and a report brought back to the OCC HOSC (Oxfordshire Joint Health Overview and Scrutiny Committee).



New Loos!

Refurbishment work on the Portway Car Park toilets plus a changing place facility is scheduled to finish in mid-December.

This is a District Council-owned facility but Wantage Town Council has funded part of the cost.

A motion proposed by Cllr Jane Hanna and seconded by Cllr Jenny

Hannaby was recently passed unanimously at Oxfordshire County Council:

'The Council therefore calls on Cabinet to consider building on the 2018 Statement of Opinion by commissioning, before the end of this financial year, while funding resources remain available, a DfT-compliant Strategic Outline Business Case, and an initial assessment of financing options for a new rail station for Wantage and Grove'

This project development work would build on the example of the Strategic Outline Business Case for the new Oxford–Eynsham–Witney–Carterton 'Windrush Line' which has recently been completed successfully.

It would also fit with the ambitions of increased investment in an inclusive, integrated, county-wide active and sustainable travel network fit for the 21st century, to improve choice and reduce car journeys.

COMMUNITY BUS WORKING GROUP UPDATE



A big thank you to everyone who contributed to the Transport Needs Survey that was carried out for us during October by Community First Oxfordshire. The results of the survey will help us to plan the detailed route for a bus service.

Thanks also to Leaflet Delivery Team/ Redcore Marketing who delivered flyers and to Vale Community Impact, Wantage Library, the Mably Way GP practices, The Beacon and Hendred Stores who carried paper copies of the survey form for us.

We have taken the initial steps towards operations by setting up a Community Interest Company – Wantage and District Community Transport – and applying for a licence to run a bus service. Also in progress is our application for Wantage to receive the so-called Section 106 funding from the Kingsgrove development which is earmarked for a community bus.

Please do get in touch if you think you can help us as we move closer to operating a service and look out for updates in future newsletters.

All of us are frustrated by the eastern relief road not being completed.

The facts are that both the eastern and western ends built by St Modwen the developers of the Crab Hill development are complete including the roundabouts – many will remember the traffic hold-ups associated with their construction!!!

The good news is that the contractors appointed by Oxford County Council are now building the centre section and completion and the opening of the relief road is expected by June next year.

That will then direct through traffic away from the town centre along Mably Way and Denchworth Road making the town centre a much better and pleasant place to live and work in!!

SIDs (Speed Indicator Devices)



Following complaints from members of the public about vehicle speeds in various places around the town, Wantage Town Council has installed Speed Indicator Devices (SIDs) in the following locations: Charlton Road, Denchworth Road, Grove Road and Ormond Road. These units will alert drivers to the actual speed they are travelling and display a message if their speed is excessive. The Council expects that the SIDs will help it to improve road safety in the town.

Looking ahead to 2024 – Bigger and better Town Events for Wantage!
